**COMMENT:**

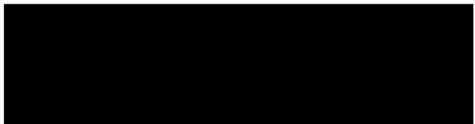
The investigation into the missing person Peter Karl BAUMANN was investigated under Eagle I investigation, Strike Force BLISSETT. On the 30<sup>th</sup> of June 2008 a P79A was submitted to the coroner in relation to the missing person BAUMANN. On the 17<sup>th</sup> of September 2008, a brief of evidence was submitted to the Coroner in relation to this investigation.

On the 4<sup>th</sup> of August 2009, an inquest was held at Westmead Coroners Court before The Coroner, Mr Milovanich. All correspondence has been filed as case files at Eastern Suburbs LAC.

Mr Milovanich finalised the matter on the 4<sup>th</sup> of August 2009 by way of an open finding.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

As this matter is finalised and an inquest held, the requested information is not required. Recommend that this file be forwarded to Missing persons for their attention.

The Missing Persons Unit is currently working with the State Coroner regarding Long Term Missing Persons Cases. An audit has recently been conducted of the Missing Persons Database (MPDB) and COPs and a significant number of Long Term Missing Persons Cases have been identified in which there has been no P79B Report of Suspected Death to the Coroner form submitted.

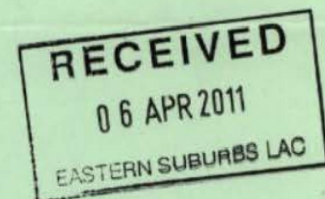
Section 35 of the Coroners Act, 2009 states, Police have an "Obligation to report a death or suspected death". Once satisfied that no further enquiries can be made as to whether a missing person is living or not, the officer in charge of the investigation must report the matter to the Coroner. Depending on the circumstances, this should occur as soon as the investigator is of the belief that the missing person is now deceased, and in any case after 12 months has elapsed.

The Missing Persons Unit is now requesting that a P79B form be submitted via email to #MPU and to the State Coroner at #CORONERP79B for the above matter or advise why this course of action cannot occur. If this is the case, the original event is required to be updated accordingly.

This will ensure that the Missing Persons Unit is in possession of the most current information available relating to the investigation and will also assist us in liaising with the State Coroner where appropriate.
