

Statement of Kay WARREN

Brief Description: Mrs WARREN states that last time she spoke to her son was on Sunday the 16/07/1989 as he was in the habit of calling her every Sunday night. Mrs WARREN states on 24/07/1989 she received a telephone call from Win4 - staff looking for Ross WARREN. Ms WARREN said she received approximately six keys (home x 2, car x 2, PO box, work) and a Nissan Pulsar sedan. The car at this stage was registered in Queensland as [REDACTED].

Summary:

Para 3: Last speaks with Ross WARREN on Sunday 16/07/1989. Usual he calls his mother every Sunday night.

Para 4: Advised of the disappearance through Ross WARREN's employers.

Para 10: Receives keys (approximately six) and car from Bondi Police Station. Vehicle later registered in Queensland as [REDACTED].

STATES:

I am a married woman, 51 years of age and I reside with my Husband Alan Grant WARREN at [REDACTED], Surfers Paradise.

I am the Mother of Ross Bradley WARREN born 26/10/64 and in 1989 he was a resident in Wollongong NSW and employed by WIN TV in Wollongong as a News broadcaster.

I last spoke to my Son Ross WARREN on the night of Sunday the 16th day of July, 1989 as he rang me every Sunday night. At that time the conversation was normal and there was no problems that I knew of.

On Monday the 24/7/89 I was contacted by his employers who asked me if I knew where Ross might be as he hadn't turned up for work.

At about 10am on the 24/7/89 I contacted the Paddington Police after the information was given to me by WIN TV.

I then had a conversation with Detective BOWDITCH who told me that Ross's car had been found and that his friends had found his keys.

On the 26th July, 1989 Alan and I arrived in Sydney and spoke to Detective BOWDITCH.

We were shown where the car and the keys had been found.

It is my understanding that his friend Craig ELLIS who he used to stay with when he was in Sydney was the person who found Ross's keys at the rocks.

On Thursday the 27th July, 1989 at Bondi Police Station we were given the keys and the car.

To the best of my knowledge there could have been possibly six keys returned to us with all the keys on the one keyring in a rusty condition. I believe there was two keys to his unit, possibly two keys to his car, one to his private mailbox, work key.

The car is a Nissan PULSAR sedan, 4 door, light bronze in colour now registered in QLD as 767AXX which was at that time owned by Ross.

There is no information that I can supply as to the disappearance of my son Ross Bradley WARREN.
