I have checked my records concerning this investigation. I did not investigate this matter initially. The only knowledge I have of this matter is what is recorded in this file and information that I was told by retired Detective Sergeant K.J BOWDITCH, in the past 7 days.

He informed me that in his opinion it was not a murder investigation and that he had forwarded a Brief of evidence concerning this matter to the Coroners Court, Glebe in early 1990.

Perhaps Constable Daniel ROBINSON, who took the initial missing person report maybe able to assist with further information.

RECOMMENDATION:
That this file be forwarded to the Sergeant assisting the Coroner at the Glebe Coroners Court for a search to be made for this information.
