- 1. This statement made by me accurately sets out the evidence which I would be prepared, if necessary, to give in court as a witness. The statement is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and I make it knowing that, if it is tendered in evidence, I shall be liable for prosecution if I have wilfully stated in it anything which I know to be false, or do not believe to be true.
- 2. I am 42 years of age.
- I have been with WIN Television Network for the past thirteen years. In the last ten years I have been the Managing Director of the network. We employee eight hundred people across five states of Australia.
- I know a person by the name of Ross Bradley WARREN. He was employed with the WIN Television as an on air presenter. He commenced with the company in May, 1987. His main duties were weather on air presentation and relief news presentation.
- Ross seemed to be happy at work. He was well liked member of the staff. Ross had an easy personality and got along well with his other staff members. Ross kept his private life reasonably quite. I personally didn't know much about Ross outside of work. Ross did tell me once that he was gay and asked if it effected his employment in which I had told him that, there

were no problems with that. It was common knowledge with the staff that Ross was a homosexual. Ross was a very good television presenter. The only temporary set back in the job was his youth. He had joined WIN television from a smaller station and was working his way up the ladder at WIN. Ross was close with the on air presenting team.

- 6. In the week prior to the 29/7/1989 when Ross disappeared I didn't notice any difference in his behaviour. I can't recall the last time I saw Ross at work but it would have been in the last couple of days before his disappearance. I didn't work with Ross closely and would really only see him in the corridors and would say 'hello'. Most of my contact with Ross would have been if there was a problem or a significant development in his career. In other words contract renewal, promotion, change of duties etc.
- 7. Since Ross's disappearance I have not heard from him nor have I heard from anyone that has heard from Ross. There has also been no talk amongst the staff about why Ross went missing.
