2.	l am 35	I am 35 years of age.				
3.	I joined the NSW Police Service in October, 1985. After the academy I was based at Central Police Station from January, 1986 until I was then transferred in September 1986 to Wollongong. I remained at Wollongong for about 18 months. I was later transferred to Nowra in 1988 or 1989. On the 3 rd September, 1989 I commenced Detectives training in Plain Clothes at Nowra Police Station. I stayed at Nowra until I resigned from the Police Service in 1993.					
4.	Whilst I was in Nowra I was living at through Ray WHITE in Nowra. It is two story white hardyplank house on a corner block. Our unit was the upstairs level. I was sharing the unit with a Navy Stewardess, (I'm not sure of the correct spelling). She worked at HMAS Alatross at the Senior Sailors Mess. was about 19 or 20 years of age at this time.					
5.	made friends with a person by the name of NP57 who was about 17 years of age at the time. I think NP57 was living on and off with her mother at Nowra but she would stay with friends most of the time. I said, "Well, what happened then?"

She said, "I was in Sydney with a car full of mates and we would just drive along and they would just pick out blokes and flog them."

I said, "Why?"

She said, "Just roll them and teach them not to be fucken poofters."

I said, "Well, what are you telling me for?"

She said, "I think one of them might have died. I think one of them may have been that TV guy."

I said, "Who do you mean?"

She said, "That WARREN guy. They robbed him and bashed him."

I said, "Where did this happen?"

She said, "I don't know, near some cliffs."

I said, "From what you've told me, it's certainly something you should discuss with the Detectives."

She said, "No."

I said, "One of the Detectives at Nowra is Mark WINTERFLOOD. He is really easy to get along with."

She said, "No, I don't want to."

I said, "Mark's really easy to talk to and very non-judgmental. At least just try and talk to him. If you meet him and don't like him, just come back to me 'cause it's a pretty serious matter."

8. When NP57 spoke to me she did not appear to be affected by dugs or alcohol. She appeared genuine in her concern for the actions of her friends, NP57 then went away
