STATES:-

1. This statement made by me accurately sets out the evidence which I would be prepared, if necessary, to give in court as a witness. The statement is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and I make it knowing that, if it is tendered in evidence, I shall be liable to prosecution if I have wilfully stated in it anything which I know to be false or do not believe to be true.

2. I am 27 years of age.

3. I am employed as a Bar Attendant at the Holiday Inn - MENZIES Hotel located in Carrington Street, Sydney. I am employed on a casual basis and work in the 'PUNT & PINT BAR' and the 'TERRACE BAR', as well as about 10 -12 other bars around the Wynyard ramp area.

4. I knew Robert MALCOLM by his christian name only as I have seen him on a regular basis mainly in the 'PUNT & PINT BAR' and to a lesser extent in the 'TERRACE BAR'. I have known Robert to drink to excess every time he entered either bar. I would say that this would have been at least on three occasions per week and often more. He usually drank 'Reschs' beer and rum and cokes. He always left either bar well affected by the beer and rum.

5. About 5pm Friday the 10th of January, 1992, I started work at the 'PUNT & PINT' bar. About 8pm - 8.30pm I saw Robert come into the bar. He ordered a schooner of Reschs and I gave him one. I saw that he was drinking with two other males - I only know one as 'Jack'.

6. The bar was pretty busy on this night and I did not see Robert again all night. I could not say what time he left or if he left with anyone else.

7. On Monday the 13th of January, 1992, I spoke to Detective BULLOCK in the Security office of the Menzies Hotel. She showed me a picture. I recognised the picture to be that of Robert MALCOLM, who was in the 'PUNT & PINT BAR' on Friday night.

8. I have been a barman for about 2 years and have seen many people affected by intoxication liquor. During the time that I knew Robert MALCOLM I would say that he always drank to excess and did become a nuisance when he drank.
