- 6. After seeing a photo presented to me by the Police at Redfern Police Station earlier today, I recognised the individual as being a regular customer at the Subway Hotel. I don't know his name.
- 7. As far as seeing him early on Saturday morning, the ll January 1992, I'm not sure but there is a very good chance that he could have been there. He was a regular Saturday morning drinker. He would drink early in the morning to mid afternoon.
- 8. On that particular day, on Saturday 11 January 1992, I did have a bandage on my right arm, because of an accident in which I was burnt while competing in the Sydney to Hobart Yacht race.
- 9. I was a shown a second photograph with four people in it. The man who was on the far left of the photo which was pointed out to me, I did not recognise.
