1. This statement made by me accurately sets out the evidence which I would be prepared, if necessary, to give in Court as a witness.
2. The statement is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and I made it knowing that, if it is tendered in evidence, I shall be liable to prosecution if I have wilfully stated in it anything which I know to be false or do not believe to be true.
- 3 I am 21 years of age.
4. I am a single woman living in a de-facto relationship with James SMITH. I live at [REDACTED] Redfern with James and my mother Joan HONEYSETT.
5. I am employed as a Community worker at the 'Community Development Employment Programme' at [REDACTED]
6. On Friday in early January, I'm not sure of the date, I went to the Clifton Hotel in Waterloo with James. It was between quarter to nine and ten to nine that night when we got there. At the Clifton James and me saw Donna MORGAN and we all sat together and played at the card machines. We were there for about three or so hours and we ended up leaving there at about twelve midnight. While I was at the Clifton I don't remember seeing Beaver HOOKEY there at all. There was a few people around but I didn't sit with anyone else

except for James and Donna.

7. After we left the Clifton Hotel, all three of us went to the top of Caroline and Eveleigh Street, up near the Housing Company and we met up with a few more people but I can't remember who they were. We all sat around near the Housing Commission steps and had a few more drinks. About 1.00am me, Donna and James walked down Eveleigh Street and seen Richard GREEN and he said to Donna,

"Can I go to your grandmother's house to ring an Ambulance?  
There's a man bashed in the empty house."

Donna said,

"No, she's asleep. You'll have to go up the station."

James, Donna and me then kept walking to Cleveland Street and got a taxi and went to the Mansions Hotel at Kings Cross. I didn't take much notice of what Richard GREEN said and I thought it might have been black fella that got bashed.

8. We stayed there at the Mansions till it closed and that was about 5.00am or 5.30am on the Saturday morning. I was sitting at the back of the Mansions all night but I don't remember seeing Beaver come in at all.
9. At about 5.30am James, me and Donna got a taxi and went to the Subway Hotel. James went into the Subway Hotel and Donna and me walked through the park back home to [REDACTED]. When I was walking down Eveleigh Street I saw alot of Police cars around at the abandon house. I don't know what happened or why they were there. I then kept walking and someone told me that a man had been bashed but I don't know who that was that told me. After that I went to sleep.
10. About ten or eleven on the Saturday morning, my mum came in and woke me

"James is around at Eveleigh Street. He just got out of a taxi with Beaver."

I then got up and went around to Eveleigh street but by the time I got there James was asleep at Uncle Darby's house. I then woke James up and he came home with me and then went back to sleep. I stayed awake and watched television.
