1. This statement made by me accurately sets out the evidence which I would be prepared, if necessary, to give in court as a witness. The statement is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and I make it knowing that, if it is tendered in evidence, I shall be liable to prosecution if I have wilfully stated in it anything which I know to be false or do not believe to be true.

2. I am 41 years of age.

3. After 2.00am on Saturday morning, early in January this year, I was at home when my mother, Dorothy [REDACTED] woke me up. She said to me, "hop up, there's all police down at Holden Street". I got up and went outside and I saw about three police cars down near Holden Street. I was with my mum Dorothy, my sister. A young police women told me that a man had been hurt in the empty house on the corner of Holden Street and Eveleigh Street. I stayed up until about 5am, but there was nothing else I could do and I didn't see or talk to anyone who might have been involved in it.

4. That morning, about 10.30am, in Eveleigh Street, Redfern, I saw Beaver HOOKEY and James SMITH get out of a taxi in Eveleigh Street. I heard them talking, one of them said, "who is going to pay for the taxi from the subway". I don't know which one of them payed the money. They then went over to Darby WARDS place and walked inside. They were inside for about half an hour or so and then they came back out and walked down Eveleigh Street, towards the City.

They went to the empty house on the corner of Eveleigh Street and Holden Street. This was about 11am or a little after. I saw Beaver HOOKEY had a bundle of twenty dollar notes in his left hand. There could of been a couple of hundred dollars, but I am not sure.

Beaver HOOKEY said to James SMITH, " I'll give you eighty dollars and I'll shout the grog for the rest of the day".

James SMITH said, " What about the other money you've got in your underpants?",

Beaver said, " I haven't got any money ",

They then started arguing and walked away back up Eveleigh Street, towards Redfern.
