1. This statement made by me accurately sets out the evidence which I would be prepared, if necessary, to give in Court as a witness.
2. The statement is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and I made it knowing that, if it is tendered in evidence, I shall be liable to prosecution if I have wilfully stated in it anything which I know to be true or do not believe to be true.
- 3 I am 20 years of age.
4. About 5.00pm on Friday, the 10th January, 1992 I left my Aunty Linda's house at [REDACTED] Waterloo and went to the Somerset Hotel with my mum, Patricia HOOKEY. I stayed there playing the card machine with my mum until about 5.30 or 6.00pm, and then I went around to the TAB in Morehead Street. I was there for about 15 minutes, then I left there and come back around to Aunty Linda's place until about 6.30pm. Then I left and walked to what used to be the Black Theatre at the corner of Cope and Turner Streets, Redfern, where I was talking to my Aunty, Michelle HOOKEY. There was a crowd of about ten Koories there. I left

there about ten to seven and walked down to Eveleigh Street. I went through the street behind the TNT buildings and past the Redfern Railway Station onto Lawson Street, and then turned right into Eveleigh Street. I got there about five to seven.

5. I walked down Eveleigh Street and I stopped to talk to two sisters, Tracy and Mary [REDACTED]. I talked to them for about half an hour and I left them and walked to the Clifton Hotel in Regent Street, Redfern. I got there at roughly a quarter to eight. At the Clifton Hotel I had my first drink of alcohol which was a beer. I was playing pool against Barbara STACEY, I won a couple of games and stayed at the table for a while. After that I talked to my Aunty Michelle HOOKEY and my cousin, Maria HOOKEY, and my other cousin, Matt PERRY. Maria HOOKEY lives at [REDACTED], and Matt PERRY lives in unit number [REDACTED] on the [REDACTED], [REDACTED].

6. I left that group and walked out the door of the hotel and talked to Debbie MURPHY for about five minutes. Then I walked back inside and talked to Karen LOWE and then [REDACTED] 1312 and Beccy SMITH. I stayed at the Clifton Hotel talking and drinking beer until the pub closed. When the pub closed I was walking with my ex-girlfriend, Dianne McGUINNESS, and her cousin, Tracy McGUINNESS, up Regent Street towards Westpac. When I was on the corner of Regent Street and Redfern Street, Redfern outside the Westpac Bank I saw [REDACTED] 1312, Beccy SMITH and Karen LOWE get in a taxi, and I jumped

in the taxi with them. We went to Kings Cross in the taxi.

7. When we got to Kings Cross, I jumped out of the taxi and walked into the Mansions Hotel. I don't know where the girls went after they got out of the taxi. I walked into the Mansions Hotel and seen my Auntie Michelle HOOKEY and her friend, Victor. I sat in there with them for about half an hour, I didn't have a drink there. After I left them I walked out and seen a mate who works at the Mansions Hotel. I told him I was going for a walk and I then walked down to the Crest Hotel near the train station in Kings Cross and I went to the toilet there. I went to the entrance to the train station which was closed, and I sat down there for about ten minutes. Then I walked up and down the main street of Kings Cross. I don't know what time it was but it was in the early hours of Saturday morning. Then I ran into Dianne McGUINNESS in the main street and I walked around with her until it started coming light. Then I got on the train with Dianne and I went to the Subway Hotel at Central with Dianne.
8. When I went into the Subway Hotel it was daylight. I was talking to the bloke who works there, I think his name is Greg, who had a bandage on his arm. Then I started talking to my Aunty, Dot HOOKEY. I had one beer there. I told my aunty and her friends that I was going home. Dianne stayed at the Subway Hotel. I walked out to Central Railway Station and I caught a train to Redfern. I got off at Redfern and when I got off the train a bloke who had spoken to me at the

Subway Hotel also got off the train. He spoke to me again in Lawson Street, just outside the entrance to the railway station. I walked down Eveleigh Street and I went and seen Karen LOWE's brother. He was drinking and he offered me a drink but I didn't have one. When I left Karen's brother, whose name is Tommy, I again seen the bloke who had spoken to me in the Subway Hotel and outside the railway station. He seemed to have followed me down because he was just standing there. I walked with him up to Redfern Street.

9. When I walked to Redfern Street with this bloke, Renee [REDACTED] also walked with us. She'd been at Tommy's house or the house next door when I was talking to him. This bloke, a white bloke whose name I don't know, stopped to use the automatic teller machine at the Commonwealth Bank in Redfern Street. That's when the Police picked me up and took me to Redfern Police Station.

10. When I went out on Friday afternoon I was wearing the shirt I'm wearing now, a short sleeved black and white 'Sweathog' T-shirt and grey tracksuit pants, and the Lotto brand joggers I'm wearing now, and the socks I'm wearing now, white with a green and blue stripe on each sock. This is the same clothing I was wearing when the Police picked me up on Saturday.
