

1. This statement made by me accurately sets out the evidence which I would be prepared, if necessary, to give in Court as a witness.
2. The statement is true to the best of my knowledge and belief and I made it knowing that, if it is tendered in evidence, I shall be liable to prosecution if I have wilfully stated in it anything which I know to be false or do not believe to be true.
- 3 I am 28 years of age.
4. On the 11th of January, this year, I went to Redfern Police Station and made a statement about a bloke that was assaulted in Holden Street in the abandon house. I gave the statement to Detective Morland. As far as I am concerned the statement I made is true and correct.
5. In addition to the statement that I made on the 11th of January, I want to add that on the Friday night before, which was the 10th of January I went to bed at 6.30pm at the 'Factory'. When I went to sleep Kirk wasn't at the Factory but I think Garry was there. I was asleep for about seven and a half hours when I was woken up by some noise. This was about ten to two in the morning. I could hear in the kitchen area Kirk PHILLIPS and Richard GILMORE, who also goes by the name of "Mad Max". It sounded like they were chastising a group of boys about stealing money from the pinball machines in the Factory. Kirk then went to the toilet and things went quiet and

Richard GILMORE said to the boys, who were [ 1308 ], [ 1310 ] and a couple of other boys who I don't know their names, when Kirk was out of the room, "You'd better listen to him, tonight you become men." Things then went a little quieter and I got up and went to the other blokes and I listened for a bit. After that Kirk came back in. I then spoke to the boys about not thieving and I smacked one of the boys on the leg which was [ 1310 ], I think. Max then said, "Let's go across the road for a smoke." After that, about 2.00am, we went outside to the house across the road from the Factory and we were going to have a smoke when a young fella, who I don't know said, "Some bloke's just been brought from Kings Cross, bashed and rolled. He's down there." When he said that he was pointing to the abandon house.

6. After that the other statement that I made takes over.

7. On the day after the man was assaulted, the Saturday, and after the Police left about 1.00pm or 2.00pm, I saw a long piece of wood in the abandon house. The wood was about three feet long and it was as round as a baseball bat. I saw that it had blood and hair all over it. I don't know where that piece of wood is now or where it went to on that day.
