- I am employed as a Postman at the Darlinghurst Post Office, 3. situated at 247 Crown Street, Darlinghurst. I usually arrive at work at 4.55am, I always walk to work.
- About 4.40am on Thursday 23 December 1993, I left home and commenced walking to work. I came through Hannam Street into Flinders street, I then crossed over the road and went into Circle K which is in Flinders Street and brought a paper. As I came out of circle K I noticed that three polynesian males crossing over Flinders Street, from the other side, they crossed about where Taylor Street, mets Flinders, I assumed they had been at the taxi club.

5. When the crossed over they were in front of me and I continued to walk up Flinders street behind them, I was about 50 yards behind them. I then saw them cross Flinders Street, prior to the intersection of Bourke Street. They crossed and then went on to the grass park at that intersection, they then crossed Bourke street in front of the entrance to Kinselas and then walked down to the corner of Oxford Bourke Streets, that was the last I saw of these three males.

- 6. When I arrived at the point where the three Polynesian males had crossed Flinders street, to the park, I could see a Police vehicle and two police men and a person lying on the ground. I crossed Bourke Street and commenced to walk down Campbell street, I noticed the Police around this person on the ground, I did not see any ambulance at this time.
- 7. I did not see the faces of these three Polynesian males, I don't recall what they were wearing but I recall one of them was a big bloke with thick curly hair, similiar to an 'Afro' style hair. I also recall one of the others was a slight build and quite young.
