THE NSW National Parks and Wildlife Service has been cleared of corruption alleyations relating to wildlife sinuaging and the kangaroo meat industry.

ICAC Innumeration

ICAC inquiries had falled to reveal any evidence of corrupt conduct by NPWS officers, the service said yesterday

Last June. Environ-ment Minister Chris Hartcher directed that claims made in the book Smuggled: the Under-ground Trade In Australia's Wildilfe be re-ferred to the ICAC.

The book by Raymond Hoser, alleged various officers' involvement in activities in wildlife smuggling and the meat industry.

Mr Hartcher said yes-terday false accusations such as those made by Mr Hoser detracted from the excellent work being carried out by the NPWS in the management and protection of NSW native wildlife.


