## Dear Mr Hodgetts,

Thank you for your email. By way of update, the Inquiry is organising for the transport of the white card to FETS and has indicated to FASS that Senior Sergeant Coady should be the contact person in this regard.

The Inquiry proposes to complete the first two steps set out below, namely:

- 1. DNA testing via a "tape lift" to secure any opportunity for retrieval of DNA;
- 2. After a tape lift has been undertaken, a first level of fingerprint treatment to identify any fingerprints on the exhibit. As you explain in your email below, this process preserves any DNA that may be present.

If no fingerprints can be identified after these steps have been undertaken, then I will be in contact with you about next steps.

All of this is subject to any reservations FASS may have in relation to the above two steps.

I anticipate that Ms Franco or another member of staff of FASS may be in touch in relation this shortly. FASS will also organise transportation of the other paper found in Mr Dye's clothing, namely a yellow post-it note, for fingerprint testing. FASS does not anticipate that any useful DNA can be extracted from this yellow paper, and that fingerprinting may yield more useful results.
