

# Special Commission of Inquiry into LGBTIQ hate crimes

### Statement of Jacqueline Krynda

#### As at 18 June 2023

This statement made by me accurately sets out the evidence that I would be prepared, if necessary, to give to the Special Commission of Inquiry into LGBTIQ hate crimes as a witness. The statement is true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

- 1. My name is Jacqueline Jane Krynda. My address is known to the Special Commission of Inquiry into LGBTIQ hate crimes (the Inquiry).
- 2. I am employed as a Senior Solicitor by the Inquiry.
- I have reviewed materials and conducted inquiries in relation to the death of Crispin Wilson Dye (Mr Dye), born 1 June 1952, who died at approximately 6:30pm on 25 December 1993 at St George Hospital, Kogarah.

#### Request for coronial file

- 4. On 11 May 2022, the Inquiry issued a written request to the Registrar of the Coroners Court of NSW at Lidcombe (**The Coroners Court**) for the coronial file in relation to, *inter alia*, the death of Mr Dye.
- 5. On 25 August 2022, the Coroners Court produced material pursuant to that request.

#### Summons for police files and documents

- 6. On 18 May 2022, the Inquiry issued a summons to the NSW Police Force (**NSWPF**) for, *inter alia*, the investigative file in relation to the death of Mr Dye (summons NSWPF1). A hardcopy file, consisting of nine boxes of material, was produced on 8 June 2022.
- 7. On 25 August 2022, a summons to the NSWPF was issued for all NSWPF records in relation to, *inter alia*, Strike Force Parrabell (summons NSWPF12). This material was produced in tranches between 9 September 2022 and 14 February 2023.

#### Testing of exhibits

- 8. On 28 September 2022, the Inquiry wrote to the NSWPF requesting their assistance in identifying and locating the physical exhibits held by the NSWPF in relation to Mr Dye's case. On 30 September 2022, the NSWPF advised the Inquiry by email that some exhibits had been located. On 7 October 2022, the NSWPF provided details of the eight exhibits which had been located.
- 9. On 1 November 2022, a conference was held between Inquiry staff and representatives of the Forensic and Analytical Science Service (FASS). FASS advised that they did not hold any files or exhibits in relation to Mr Dye.
- 10. The exhibits located by the NSWPF, as above in [8], were sent to FASS at the request of the Inquiry.
- 11. On 7 February 2023, I was advised by way of a telephone call from Michele Franco, Group Manager of the Evidence Recovery Unit, Forensic Biology/DNA at FASS that FASS had received eight exhibits from the New South Wales Police Force (**NSWPF**) relating to the death of Mr Dye and were commencing forensic testing procedures on them.
- 12. On 14 February 2023, Ms Franco informed me by telephone that FASS had found two pieces of paper in Mr Dye's shirt (exhibit number X0000638079) folded inside the top left front pocket. On 16 February 2023, Ms Franco informed me in a telephone conversation that the two pieces of paper would not be tested and would be separated from the other exhibits relevant to Mr Dye's case until instructions were received from the Inquiry.
- 13. In the same telephone call, Ms Franco advised me that an area of the back right pocket of Mr Dye's jeans (exhibit number X0000638075) had blood on it which contained a mixture of DNA that originated from two individuals: Mr Dye and an unknown male. Ms Franco informed me that, due to the passage of time, only a limited number of markers could be retrieved in relation to the unknown male profile.
- 14. On 19 April 2023, Ms Franco advised me that two more markers had been recovered from the unknown male profile.
- 15. On 31 May 2023, Ms Franco informed me that the profile that had been recovered from the brown mark on the white card was consistent with Mr Dye's profile. I subsequently organised for the white card and the yellow post-it note to be sent to the NSWPF for fingerprint testing.

#### Contact with Clem Van Der Weegen

- 16. On 2 November 2022, Mr Clem Van Der Weegen contacted the Inquiry in relation to his experience as the NSWPF coronial advocate in the second day of the coronial hearing into Mr Dye's death on 8 August 1995.
- 17. On 8 November 2022, the Inquiry's Director of Investigations, Brendan Rook, had a telephone conversation with Mr Van Der Weegen about the evidence given at the inquest by Mr Fong. Mr Rook indicated to me that he had formed the view that no further information was required from Mr Van Der Weegen as his account was consistent with the transcripts of the inquest.

#### Contact with Mr Dye's friends

- 18. On 13 December 2022, Inquiry staff held a conference with Richard Cobden SC. Mr Cobden SC subsequently provided a signed statement to the Inquiry on 26 May 2023.
- 19. On 15 February 2023, the Inquiry identified a "Garry Hook" who was recorded as living in an address in Earlwood, which matched a phone number contained on a yellow post-it note located in Mr Dye's pocket. On 23 March 2023, a conference was held between Inquiry staff, Mr Hook, and his partner, Steven Hodges. The Inquiry subsequently obtained a signed statement from Mr Hook on 30 May 2023.
- 20. On 11 April 2023, a conference was held between Inquiry staff and Colin Copnell. On 26 May 2023, the Inquiry subsequently obtained a signed statement from Mr Copnell.
- 21. On 22 May 2023, a conference was held between Inquiry staff and Colin Dorrington. Mr Dorrington provided information regarding Mr Dye's life, the events around his death and his sexuality. Mr Dorrington confirmed that, in his view, Mr Dye was a gay man and he was unaware of Mr Dye having any relationships with women. He confirmed that the NSWPF records were correct and that Mr Dye had "come out" to his mother on his trip to Sydney in December 1993 and Mr Dye's mother had initially reacted negatively.

#### Review of NSWPF holdings about assaults in Little Oxford Street area

22. On 28 April 2023, the Inquiry issued a summons to the NSWPF (summons NSWPF95) for information relating to 'offences against the person' that had occurred in the Little Oxford Street area in Darlinghurst during the period from July 1993 to July 1994. On 12 May 2023, NSWPF produced 65 documents in response to the summons.
