ANTECEDENTS

The defendant us currently on a pension and is living with his sister.

FULL FACTS

Between 8:45pm and 9:00pm on the 10th day of February 2002, the defendant attended the premises of 6 Cookson Place at Glenwood.

The defendant has walked around the rear of the premises at which time he has taken a pottery planter box and thrown it through the lounge room window at the rear of the premises.

When this has occurred the next door neighbour has heard the glass break and a short time later has heard the alarm sounding. She has looked out her window and saw the defendant walking past the victims house, then past her house and towards the top of her street.

A short time later the defendant returned to the victims premises and walked down the side of the victims house towards the rear of the premises.

The defendant entered the rear lounge room window of thepremises and stole a Sharp video cassette recorder, serial no. 905723461 from the victims bedroom. The defendant has jumped out the rear window with the VCR under his arm and crouched down as the security guard pulled up in the driveway. As the security guard was getting out of his vehicle the defendant ran past the security guards vehicle and ran into Dare Street still holding the VCR.

The security guard has released his two security guard dogs. The dogs and the security guard have chased the defendant through Dare Street and onto Sorrento Drive near the intersection of Sunnyholt Road. The security dog has grabbed the defendant by the ankle and the security guard has grabbed the defendant.

The security guard has returned to the victims premises with the defendant. Police attended a short time later. When Police examined the rear lounge window blood was seen on the glass. There was also blood stains leading from the rear of the premise to the front. This blood trial also lead in the direction where the security guard and his dog apprehended the defendant.
