34		[At] about 1.30pm on the 29th of December
35		1988, I went with Plain Clothes Constable
36		Bramah to a dwelling house at [number]
37		Newton Street, Alexandria, where we had
88	ć	a conversation with Constables Taylor and
39	1	Mitchell and [then] went with them to the
10	Į.	bathroom of that house. There I saw the
11	(deceased beside the bathtub in a kneeling
12		position, with his head and arms hanging
13		into the bath. I noticed that the deceased
14		was dressed only in a T-shirt, the bath tap
15		was running and blood was on the sides of
16		the bathtub.
17	,	

A further examination of the premises 1 2 revealed that there was no sign of any struggle or forced entry to the dwelling. 3 4 There were blood spots along the side 5 passageway of the house and all through the 6 rooms of the house. Blood was also noticed 7 on the double bed and pillow of the front 8 bedroom. Blood spots were also found on 9 the front verandah of the dwelling at Newton Street [next door] which is 10 occupied by Mr Ron Sigsworth. These spots 11 12 were near a wooden railing adjacent to the 13 side passageway of the deceased's home. 14 15 Later that afternoon, Police from the Crime Scene Unit and Fingerprint Section attended 16 and made an examination of the deceased and 17 the dwelling house. 18 19 20 Inquiries were [also] made of the 21 neighbours in Newton Street. 22 23 At the completion of the examination, 24 photographing and retaining exhibits, the deceased was rolled over onto his back and 25 26 it was noticed that he had a 3cm laceration 27 above his left eye and swelling to that 28 same eye, lips and jaw. 29 30 About 4.10pm that same day, Dr Sylvia Hollinger, the Government Medical Officer, 31 32 attended the home and made an examination of the body of the deceased. 33 34 35 [And] after the body had been removed by the contractors, the house was secured. 36 37 38 On the 11th January 1989, as a result of 39 information received, I attended the home of a Mr Harry John Berwick at 40 41 Mitchell Road, Alexandria, and after 42 having a conversation with him, later saw him at Redfern Police Station where 43 44 a statement was taken from him. 45 Later that same date, whilst in the 46

47

Detectives' office, I spoke with a Mr Peter

Thomas Martin, an Ordinance Inspector with 1 2 the South Sydney Council, and a statement was obtained from him. 3 4 5 On the 16th of January 1989 I interviewed a Mr Robert Joseph Dunn and obtained 6 7 a statement from him. 8 9 During the course of the investigation into 10 the death of the deceased, Detective Sergeant Neville Smith of the Homicide Unit 11 12 was informed of the circumstances and the 13 result of inquiries made. A canvass of Buckland Street, Alexandria, which is the 14 15 nearest and only residential area near the toilets in Alexandria Park and face Park 16 This canvass produced no worthwhile 17 18 results from the occupants. [And] since 19 receiving the information that the deceased 20 had been assaulted and robbed in or near 21 Alexandria Park, youths of the hoodlum 22 element and are known to frequent the park 23 and ... nearby areas were spoken to but 24 with negative results. 25 26 At the request of Detective Sergeant Smith 27 of the Homicide Unit, the brother of the 28 deceased, Mr Stuart Allen, was contacted requesting a photograph of the deceased 29 with the view of having it placed in the 30 31 Daily Mirror newspaper together with 32 a story surrounding the death of his brother, but after consultation with the 33 34 other members of his family, [that] request was denied. He stated that the family did 35 not wish any further publicity. 36 37 38 SGT SHIELDS: Thank you, Sergeant. I tender that 39 statement, your Worship. 40 41 HIS WORSHIP: All right. It will be the next 42 exhibit number, 7. 43 EXHIBIT #7 STATEMENT OF DETECTIVE SERGEANT SAUNDERS 44 45

correct? 1 2 A. Yes. 3 4 SGT SHIELDS: I will read the contents of that to 5 your Worship. 6 7 HIS WORSHIP: Yes. 8 9 SGT SHIELDS: 10 Approximately 12.50pm on Thursday. 11 12 29 December 1989, in company with Constable 13 Mitchell, I attended Newton Street, Alexandria, in regard to information 14 15 received ... 16 17 Upon arrival, I spoke to David Oliver, of 18 . who told me 19 something. 20 21 I then entered Newton Street, Alexandria, via the side gate and walked 22 along the northern footpath alongside the 23 24 premises to the rear of the premises. Whilst walking along I noticed what 25 appeared to be dried drops of blood on the 26 27 footpath leading from the front gate to the rear of the premises. At the rear of the 28 premises I noticed that the back door was 29 30 open and the bathroom window was also open 31 and there appeared to be dried blood on the 32 frame of the window. 33 I then looked in the bathroom window where 34 I saw the deceased, who I now know to be 35 William Emanuel Allen, born 14 August 1938, 36 kneeling alongside the bath, and his head 37 and arms were hanging in the bathtub. 38 39 the time, the water was running from the bath tap and there was blood coming from 40 41 the deceased's head into the bath. At the 42 time, the deceased was only dressed in a T-shirt. 43 44 45 I then entered the house via the back door, which was open, and the screen door was 46 47 closed but not locked. I walked through

the house and noticed drops of dried blood 1 2 throughout the house leading from the bathroom to the front bedroom. 3 The bed in 4 the front bedroom had dried blood on the 5 covers. 6 7 I then returned to the front of the 8 premises where I spoke to David Oliver, who 9 stated that he was a builder who had done some work for William Allen and had found 10 the body when he entered the rear of the 11 12 premises to collect his money. David 13 Oliver stated that he did not enter the I then spoke to Ronald Sigsworth of 14 15 Newton Street, Alexandria, who stated that he had not seen or heard anything 16 unusual happening at the deceased's 17 18 premises. 19 20 [A] search of the house showed no apparent 21 signs of forced entry and nothing appeared to have been taken from the premises. 22 23 Approximately 1.45pm I spoke to Detective 24 Sergeant Saunders and informed him [of] what had happened. 25 26 27 About 4.30pm, Dr Hollinger, a Government Medical Officer, attended the scene, and 28 I was informed by Dr Hollinger that the 29 body had been dead for about 24 hours and 30 31 there was a possibility that the deceased had been bashed at some stage as there was 32 a large swelling around the [eye] and there 33 34 was a possible fractured jaw. 35 I then accompanied Robert Gannon of 36 Newton Street, Alexandria, into the rear 37 38 of the house, where the deceased was lying, 39 and [he] identified the body to me as William Allen of Newton Street. 40 41 Alexandria. Robert Gannon had known the 42 deceased for a period of about two years. 43 44 Approximately 5.30pm, the Government

further inquiries. 1 2 3 SGT SHIELDS: I tender that station to your Worship. 4 EXHIBIT #8 STATEMENT OF CONSTABLE TAYLOR 5 6 7 SGT SHIELDS: Sergeant, a statement was also made Q. 8 from a David James Oliver; is that correct? 9 That's correct, yes. 10 SGT SHIELDS: Yes. I will read that to your Worship, on 11 12 record. 13 HIS WORSHIP: Yes. 14 15 SGT SHIELDS: 16 17 18 I am a single man, a carpenter by 19 occupation, and self employed. About two 20 weeks ago in the afternoon, I walked out 21 the front of my house, when I saw this man, whom I later found out that his name was 22 23 Bill, standing at the front of my house 24 with two dogs. He said, "Are you the 25 carpenter?" I said, "Yes." He said, "Do you want to do a job for me?" I said. 26 27 "I cannot get over there for a couple of 28 days." We agreed that I would see him at his house at Newton Street, Alexandria, 29 about 5pm the following Monday, the 19th 30 of December 1988. I went over that day and 31 32 gave him a quote for renovations to the side of his house. This was agreed to and 33 34 I commenced work on the house the following 35 Saturday. 36 I completed the work to Bill's house on 37 38 Wednesday morning, about 11am, but Bill was 39 not there at the time, to my knowledge. I'd seen him the night before, [on] 40 41 Tuesday, and told him, "There's only three 42 hours' work to do on the house. I'll finish it off tomorrow morning". He said. 43 44 "I'll be sleeping. Don't wake me up." 45 46 When I finished the job, I knocked on the 47 front door but got no response. I left,

but I did notice that his car was parked at the front of [the] house. Sometime [in the] same day, in the afternoon, I returned to his house to get payment for the work done to his house, but again got no response to my knocking. The car was still there. I did notice that the light was on in the hallway of the house. This I could see through the glass panel of the front door. Doing the remainder of the day I drove past his house but did not see him. I returned again about 8pm that night. light was still on but no person answered I also rang Bill's house several the door. times through the night, up until about 11pm, but with no answer.

I returned to Bill's house about 7.45am on Thursday morning, the 29th of December 1988, with no answer, and then again about 12.10pm the same day. After getting no response again I went to a neighbour next door, spoke to him briefly and then went to the other neighbour on the other side of Bill's house. I spoke with them and the man went down the side passageway of Bill's house and came back shortly after and [then] rang the Police.

Shortly after the Police had arrived I went with them to the rear of the house and I saw the man known to me as Bill kneeling over the side of the bathtub. I noticed he was only wearing a singlet-type top with no pants or underpants. I also noticed [that there was] blood in the bath and I think the tap was running.

SGT SHIELDS: Q. Sergeant, a further statement was obtained from a Ronald Sigsworth; is that right?

9 B J SAUNDERS x (Sgt Sheilds)

1 2 SGT SHIELDS: I will read that to your Worship, on record: 3 4 I am a widowed man residing at 5 Newton Street, Alexandria, and have 6 lived at that address for the past 8 years. 7 About two years ago, a man named Bill Allen 8 9 moved into the house next door, number ■ Newton Street, Alexandria. He took over 10 the premises from his brother Stuart and 11 12 lived there alone. 13 I believed him to be a homosexual, [as] he 14 15 had friends visit him from time to time and had barbecues and parties in the rear yard. 16 17 18 The most regular visitor to the house was a man named Robert. I don't know his last 19 20 name but he was a short, plump man, about 21 45 to 50 [years] old. 22 In the morning of the 27 of December 1988, 23 24 a Tuesday, I looked out the front window and saw Bill talking to my landlady, 25 26 Mrs Merle Savage. 27 About [12pm] on Thursday, the 29th 28 of December 1988, a neighbour from 29 ■ Newton Street, Bob Gannon, called out to 30 me and I went [to] the front and saw him 31 32 with another man. I later found out that 33 this other man was a carpenter working on 34 Bill's house. The carpenter told me that he was having trouble getting in touch with 35 Bill, so I went down the side passageway to 36 the rear door, which I saw was wide open, 37 38 as well as the flyscreen door. Bill's two 39 dogs went into the kitchen. 40 41 I called out to Bill but got no answer and 42 I heard water running into the drain. I then looked through the open bathroom 43 44 window and saw Bill slumped over the side 45 of the bath with blood on the bottom of the 46 bath and I saw the bath tap running. 47 I went home next door and called the Police

who arrived shortly after. 1 2 3 During the time that I knew Bill, I did not 4 hear any arguments or fights coming from 5 the house. He kept to himself and was 6 always pleasant. 7 8 I tender that, your Worship. 9 EXHIBIT #10 STATEMENT OF RONALD SIGSWORTH 10 11 12 SGT SHIELDS: Q. Sergeant, a statement was also obtained 13 from Eric Edward Jackson? Yes, correct. 14 15 16 SGT SHIELDS: Correct? I will read that to your Worship 17 on record: 18 I am a divorced man, a truck driver by 19 20 occupation with W.D. & H.O Wills. I have a 21 friend named Patricia Wright, who resides at Newton Street, Alexandria. 22 23 known her for about 14 years. For the past 24 three months [I've] been attending Pat's home doing house renovations for her. 25 26 Over this period [I've come] to know a neighbour of Pat's named Bill Allen, who 27 lives by himself at **M** Newton Street, 28 Alexandria. Prior to three months ago. 29 I only knew him on a casual basis. 30 believed that Bill was a homosexual. 31 32 I think he's lived there for about two years and during that period I saw a number 33 34 of male persons go into his house, mainly at night-time after 10pm. A regular 35 visitor to Bill's house was a man known 36 only to me as Robert. He drove 37 38 a light-coloured dirty-green coloured Gemini or similar make of car. Over the 39 last three months I've seen Robert at 40 41 Bill's house nearly every day. I believe that neither Robert or Bill were employed. 42 I last saw Robert at Bill's house on 43 44 Tuesday morning between 9 and 11am [on] the 45 27th of December 1988. I saw him walk out 46 the front gate and then walk back in again. 47 I never spoke to him.

1 2 About 4pm on the 28th of December 1988. I finished work and shortly after went to 3 4 Pat's house. About 7pm that night, Pat and 5 myself decided to take the dogs for a walk 6 and were walking past Bill's house when 7 I saw him standing at his front door with 8 the flyscreen partly open. Pat said to 9 him, "Did you have a lovely Christmas?" Bill replied, "You know, good." He smiled 10 and waved his hands about and said. 11 12 you?" Both of us said, "Real good." and I then kept walking and on our return, 13 about 20 minutes later, I saw both the 14 15 front flyscreen and main doors to Bill's house were closed. [This] was the last 16 time that I saw him. When I saw him 17 18 standing in the doorway, he was dressed in a T-shirt and shorts, but I could not say 19 20 what colours they were. I'm not aware of 21 any arguments that Bill may have had with 22 either neighbours or friends. He always 23 seemed a happy, friendly person. 24 I tender that to your Worship. 25 26 27 HIS WORSHIP: Thank you. Exhibit 11. 28 EXHIBIT #11 STATEMENT OF ERIC EDWARD JACKSON 29 30 31 SGT SHIELDS: Q. Sergeant, a further statement was 32 obtained from Joyce Elizabeth Allen; is that correct? 33 Yes, correct. 34 SGT SHIELDS: 35 I'll read that on record to your Worship: 36 I am a single woman, a nursing sister by 37 38 occupation, and I am currently employed as 39 a relieving administrator with the 40 41 42 I have two brothers, Stuart and William, and one sister who resides in England. 43 44 45 Before last Thursday, the 22nd of December 46 1988, I hadn't seen my brother Bill

since January this year, but during this

period I spoke to him over the phone when 1 2 I rang him about every four to six weeks. Bill was a schoolteacher up until ... 3 4 18 months ago when he went on sick leave. 5 He suffered from high blood pressure and About March 1985 he moved from his 6 stress. 7 Newtown address to his current address ... 8 Newton Street, Alexandria. My brother 9 Stuart lived there up until that time when he sold the house to Bill. 10 11 12 I last saw Bill on Thursday, the 22nd of 13 December 1988, about 11.30am, when he arrived at my home by train. 14 He stayed 15 there about an hour and left to go to the dentist for his appointment. He sounded 16 normal, happy and well. He made no mention 17 18 of his personal life. I had a suspicion that Bill was a bisexual. 19 20 21 I do know a number of Bill's friends, and one is a man known only to me as Robert. 22 He worked with Bill as a schoolteacher but 23 24 he retired last year for health reasons. I would describe Robert as being 48 old. 25 26 short, with a plump build. 27 On the night of the 29th of December 1988, 28 my brother Stuart did mention to me that 29 Bill had made arrangements to go to his 30 31 cousin's property at Mooney Mooney for 32 a few days. This was to be on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of this week. 33 34 I am not aware of any arguments that Bill 35 may have had recently with friends. [And] 36 I am not aware of any enemies that Bill may 37 38 have had. 39 40 I tender that statement to your Worship. 41 HIS WORSHIP: 42 Exhibit 12. 43 EXHIBIT #12 STATEMENT OF JOYCE ELIZABETH ALLEN 44 45 Sergeant, a further statement was 46 SGT SHIELDS: Q. 47 obtained from Patricia Alice Wright?

Α. Yes. 1 2 3 SGT SHIELDS: I'll read that statement on record: 4 5 I was born on 1931. 6 7 I have lived in Newton Street for 20 years. 8 9 I've known William Allen for a period of about two years. He moved into the street 10 to his brother's house at Mewton Street 11 12 after the brother died of AIDS. I believe 13 both Bill and his brother were homosexual. I say that because everyone in the 14 15 immediate area seemed to know. One of his next door neighbours said they could hear 16 17 them at all hours of the night. 18 I did not know Bill socially, only as 19 20 a neighbour. Particularly over the last 21 few months, as the Water Board were trying to repossess land at the rear of a number 22 of houses in the street. He seemed a very 23 24 likeable sort of bloke, very cheerful and He used to say he would never 25 polite. 26 leave the street as he liked the people so 27 much. He seemed to have [had] a lot of friends, mostly males, some similar in age 28 to him and also a younger man. He has 29 a friend who looks after his dogs when he 30 goes away. He's a short, fat man. I think 31 32 his name is Robert, and he drives a small cream or off-white car, maybe a Commodore. 33 34 I can't be sure. I think this guy used to live with him for a while, somewhere in 35 Erskinville or Paddington. 36 This fat man has a son who stole some electrical gear 37 38 from Bill, but Bill never reported it for the sake of his friend. 39 40 41 I know Bill was a teacher in a Catholic 42 convent for 24 years but as far as I know, he did not work during the time he lived in 43 Newton Street. He was studying house 44 45 decorating, I think, and he appeared 46 excited at the prospect of returning to

47

work in a new business.

1 2 The last time I saw Bill was on the 28th of December. It was around 7pm at night. 3 4 I was walking my dogs with my boyfriend, 5 Eric Jackson, along the street. As we passed Bill's house, he was out the front 6 7 on his verandah. He seemed very happy, 8 maybe a little drunk. I said to him, 9 "Hello, Bill, did you have a nice Christmas?" He just smiled and rolled his 10 head back, sort of indicating he'd had 11 a good time. When I saw him, he had no 12 13 injuries on him anywhere and he just looked normal to me. Eric and I then continued up 14 15 the street with the dogs. About 7.40pm, Eric and I returned home, passing Bill's 16 17 house on the way. I didn't see Bill this 18 time and there didn't seem to be anything 19 out of place. Eric and I then just went on 20 home. The first I knew of the incident was 21 when the Police arrived the next day. 22 23 I don't think Bill would have been the type 24 to take his own life, he was always too 25 happy. 26 27 I tender that, your Worship, exhibit 13. 28 EXHIBIT #13 STATEMENT OF PATRICIA ALICE WRIGHT 29 30 31 SGT SHIELDS: Q. Sergeant, a further statement was 32 obtained from a Harry John Berwick? Yes. it was. 33 34 SGT SHIELDS: 35 I'll read that on record to your Worship: 36 I am a single man, 34 years of age and I am 37 38 a schoolteacher by occupation, currently 39 working at 40 41 About 6.30pm on Wednesday, the 28th of December 1988, I left home in my motor 42 vehicle and went to a friend's house at 43 44 Randwick. I left there about 10pm and 45 drove along Wyndham Street, Redfern, left into Power Avenue and right into Park Road. 46

47

These streets, with Buckland Street.

surround Alexandria Park. Just past the toilet block, which was on my right, I saw a male person on the roadway just ahead of [He'd] stepped off the kerb and my car. noticed him waving and signalling. I stopped my vehicle and he came to the passenger side and shouted out, "I've been bashed", and he said either, "Can you help me?" or "Drive me home?" I noticed that his face was covered in blood. I lent across and opened the front passenger door for him. He sat in the passenger seat and I saw [that] his hands were covered in blood also. I lent across and closed his door for him. I commenced to drive off towards Buckland Street and I said, "This is a very dangerous place [for you] to be and you should report it to the Police." I also said, "Did you see who did it?" He said, " Thev bashed and kicked me whilst I was on the ground, the bastards, and they took my money and keys." He continued to direct me to his home and I kept imploring him to contact the Police. He replied, "That's what you expect when you do the beat." I believed him to be a homosexual and, by his comment, believed that he frequented that particular area of Alexandria Park. which is known to be frequented by homosexuals.

This was a green-coloured weatherboard house. Before getting out of the car, he said, "I'll have to get a spare set of keys and go back to get my car." I lent across, opened his door, he got out and I drove off and went home.

I am almost certain that this man was wearing white-coloured shorts. I could smell alcohol on his breath [and] I noticed that he was bleeding from the nose. He was most lucid in his speech and [he didn't]

1	appear to be outraged by [this] incident.

3	When I first saw this man in Park Road,
4	I did notice a small light-coloured sedan
5	parked opposite the toilet block.

In late November 1988, Bill complained to me on several occasions about pains in his legs and, for this, said he would increase his dosage of aspirin, "Ecotrin".

I believe that Bill was then taking two of these tablets per day. He was also drinking quite heavily. He would drink at least a bottle of Scotch a day and half a case of white wine as well. As the weeks went on he still complained about pains and indicated the liver area. He went and saw his doctor, Dr Grieve, and Bill told me that he had an intestinal virus. He also complained about a few nose bleeds that he was having.

About the 12th of December 1988 I went to Bill's house, but when he wouldn't answer the doorbell, I entered the house with my key and found him asleep with [a] large amount of blood over the pillow and sheets of his bed.

I panicked and called him, but he moved and woke up. There was blood on his face. He said, "What's wrong?" I said, "Look at the mess here." He said, "I must have had a nose bleed." I said, "[You'd] better get this looked at. You could drown."

Over the next couple of days he told me that he was alarmed at having found himself near the Redfern Railway Station and not knowing how he got there. He also told me the nose bleeds were continuing.

 On Tuesday, the 27th of December 1988, I went to Bill's house and got there about 11am. Whilst there, at one stage Bill stood up but complained about being dizzy. His skin [colour] changed to a terrible yellow colour and ... within seconds of him sitting down, blood commenced to pour out of both nostrils. I suggested that the matter was serious and an ambulance ... be called, however, Bill refused this offer. His nose bled for about three or four minutes. Whilst there. Bill and

I discussed his trip to his cousin's 1 2 holiday house at Mooney Mooney on the Wednesday, the 28th of December. 3 We also 4 discussed my motor vehicle, a Ford Falcon 5 station sedan, number _____, being broken down in McEvoy Street, Alexandria, and he 6 7 told me that whilst I was away on holidays, 8 he would make arrangements to have the 9 vehicle brought to his house. I left the house ... about 1.30pm that 10 afternoon. 11 12 13 During the time that I knew Bill, I was not aware of him going to Alexandria Park, 14 15 although he did walk his dogs quite often, but I believed that this would be done at 16 17 Erskinville Oval. Just over 12 months ago, 18 Bill had an AIDS test which proved 19 negative. > We were there for a few minutes when a white-coloured XB Falcon station wagon pulled up in front of the small silver car. The driver of the Falcon just sat in the car and so we walked up to him and Wayne said to him, "What's up with you?" (or something similar). He didn't say anything but just turned his head away from us. I then reached in through the window and shone the torch [into] his face and I could see that his lips were a bit swollen and there was some blood around his mouth. Wayne said to him, "Is that your blood on the road, mate?" He said, "Yes, I was bashed." Wayne said, "Is that your car?" (indicating the small silver car). He said, "Yes". Wayne said, "Why are you driving this car, then?" He said "Two or three kids have bashed me so I went [home] and got [my] friend's car." He was out of the car at this stage and Wayne said to him, "Are these your car keys?" He said, "Yes, thanks, mate." I said, "Which ... are you going to drive home?" He said, "This one." (indicating the silver one). I said, "Well, [you'd] better move the white car further up the road, as there has been a number of homosexuals getting bashed around here." He said, "Yes, I know." He said. "Can you wait here while I move the

car up?" I said, "Okay." He then drove the car about 40 yards up the road ... parked it under a street light near a tree. As he was walking back, I wrote down the registration number of the silver car, [which was] ([which was]) [an] Astra Holden, [at 12.45] (being the time). I wrote this in my work notebook.

When he came back I said to him, "You [had] better go [up] and report this to the Police." He said, "Yeah, I will. I'd just dropped into these toilets for a squirt when [these] kids got me." I said, "How did they bash you?" He said, "They kicked me when I was on the ground." I said, "Did they get your money?" He said, "No, I held onto that" (whilst grabbing [on] his back pocket. He then got into the silver car and we got into our car and we both drove away together.

I would describe the male person who we spoke to as being a white Australian, middle aged, medium build, about 5 foot 9, (175cm) tall, with short grey hair. He didn't appear to be seriously injured and he appeared to be very calm and spoke in [this] manner also.

I declare that [there] - no part of [my] statement [to be] untrue to my knowledge. I know that it may be used in legal proceedings. It accurately sets out the evidence which I would be prepared to give, if necessary, in court as a witness.

- Q. Thank you, Mr Martin. In regard to the deceased, did you form any opinion as to his state of sobriety that night?
- A. Could I have that again, please?

- Q. Did you have any did he appear to be intoxicated or did you have any --
- A. He didn't appear greatly to be intoxicated, not to what I've heard.

Yes, well, in this case, the deceased was a 50-year-old man, apparently homosexual. He is shown to have gone to Alexandria Park, a place frequented by that sort of person, and was set upon there and bashed and beaten by unknown persons least he said they were. There is no reason to doubt what It is a risk of people, as the deceased himself admitted, when you are on the beat, you take the risk that people indulge in the sport of chasing and assaulting homosexuals, which is a disgraceful state of affairs, and, indeed, this is the second case I have had where a person has died as a result of being assaulted in the park by homosexuals [sic]. Of course, one could say, "Well, you shouldn't go to the park", but one can say, I think with perhaps more strength, that you shouldn't set about in numbers to assault people to such an extent that you kill It is a dreadful sort of business and I wish the people could be caught. It is made even worse by the fact that those violent persons revel and enjoy the situation that the victims do not like to report these crimes to police because of the ignominy that attaches to their roles as cruising homosexuals, but, nevertheless, it is a very sad case and I am sorry for the deceased and his family.




