As a result of such examination I find as follows:

The blood sample (item 13) said to be from Ernest Allan HEAD was group B, Hp 2-2, PGM 2-1.

Items 1, 4, 5, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, 43 and 44 were found to comprise of human blood. Human bloodstains were present on items 17, 20, 21, 22, 23, 27 and 46.

Grouping tests were carried out on the blood, and the results are as follows:-

The blood grouping results, shown above, are all consistent with the blood having come from Ernest Allan HEAD.

Blood of group B, Hp 2-2, PGM 2-1 is found in approximately 1% of the population.

Blood was not detected on the knives (items 18 and 19).

Semen was present on the penile swab (item 2) and anal swab (item 3) in quantities insufficient for grouping.

The handkerchief (item 45) was extensively stained with semen. Grouping tests on the seminal-stained areas established the presence of both group 0, PGM 2-1 and group B blood group substances.

This finding is consistent with the semen on the handkerchief (item 45) having originated from a group O, PGM 2-1 individual and a group B individual.

Group O, PGM 2-1 blood group substances are found in approximately 13% of the population.

Saliva was detected on the cigarette butts and part used cigarettes (items 29, 30, 31 and 32). Grouping tests on the saliva established the presence of group 0 blood group substance on the non-filtered cigarette butt (item 29), three non-filtered cigarette butts (item 30), part used non-filtered cigarette (item 31) and non-filtered cigarette butt (item 32).

The hairs (items 11, 12, 14, 15, 16, 33, 34, 35, 36, 52 and 53) have been retained and will be examined at a later date if deemed necessary.
